#### Dear Prospective Candidate:

Congratulations on your decision to seek Pitkin County elective office. The Elections Department of the Pitkin County Clerk and Recorder's Office is charged with the administration of elections for federal, state, and county offices and state and county measures in Pitkin County.

This manual represents our best effort to explain the manner in which elections for county office are administered in Pitkin County. The information compiled here comes from multiple sources of law governing elections and campaign finance, including:

- The Election Code of 1992, as amended, C.R.S. §§ 1-1-101 et seq., and the Election Rules (8 CCR 1505-1) issued by the Colorado Secretary of State;
- State campaign finance laws, rules and regulations, including COLO. CONST. art. XXVIII, the Fair Campaign Practices Act, C.R.S. §§ 1-45-101 et seq., and the Secretary of State's Rules Concern Campaign and Political Finance ("CPF");
- State constitutional and statutory provisions relating to county home rule (commonly called "structural" home rule), including COLO. CONST. art. XIV, § 16, and C.R.S. §§ 30-11-501 to 30-11-513; and
- The Pitkin County Home Rule Charter, as amended, specifically Article VI, which contains provisions relating to the election of county officials and campaign finance rules unlike those applicable to every other county in the state.
- Pitkin County Code, as amended, specifically Title 4 Campaign Contributions and Expenditures.

It is the responsibility of all candidates, political committees and other persons involved in the election process to both understand and comply with all applicable laws.

DISCLAIMER: While we are eager to share our procedures with the public and respond to questions or concerns as they arise, we are not permitted to give legal advice. Therefore, interested persons should direct legal questions to and obtain independent legal advice from their own attorneys.

#### I. COUNTY ELECTIVE OFFICES

#### A. Election Dates in 2024

Presidential Primary: March 5, 2024
 Primary Election: June 25, 2024
 General Election: November 5, 2024

#### **B.** Open Offices in 2024

In 2024, three of Pitkin County's five commissioner seats are up for election:

#### 1. County Commissioner District 3

Incumbent: Greg Poschman

Term Limits: Cannot serve more than three consecutive terms
 Incumbent's reelection eligibility: Eligible; currently serving second consecutive term

#### 2. County Commissioner District 4

• Incumbent: Steve Child

Term Limits
 Cannot serve more than three consecutive terms

Incumbent's reelection eligibility: Ineligible; completing third term

#### 3. County Commissioner District 5

• Incumbent: Francie Jacober

Term Limits
 Cannot serve more than three consecutive terms

Incumbent's reelection eligibility: Eligible; currently serving first term

#### C. Candidate Eligibility

#### 1. Candidates for all Pitkin County elective offices must;

- Be at least eighteen years of age; and
- Be a registered elector of Pitkin County; and
- Have resided in the county and applicable commissioner district at least one year prior to the date of the general election on November 5, 2024; and
- Remain a resident of the county and applicable commissioner district throughout his or her term of office.

#### II. OVERVIEW: PITKIN'S "OPEN PRIMARY" FOR COUNTY OFFICES

Because of its Home Rule Charter ("HRC"), Pitkin County elects its county officials differently than other Colorado counties. Here, every registered voter is eligible to vote for every candidate for

county office, without regard to the voter's party affiliation or a candidate's party designation.<sup>1</sup> The HRC also permits candidates to run for county office with or without the designation of the political party with which they are affiliated for voter registration purposes. If a candidate desires the designation of a political party, however, he or she must obtain it in accordance with state law and the rules of the political party in question. Candidates who obtain the designation of a political party in accordance with state law are referred to below as "designated candidates" or "party designees," and candidates who do not do so are referred to as "undesignated candidates." <sup>2</sup>

In Pitkin County, if three or more candidates timely file sufficient petitions and other required papers for an office, their names and party designations (if any) will appear in alphabetical order on the primary election ballot. The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes for any given county office in the primary election, without regard to the candidates' party affiliation or designation, will be certified to appear on the ballot for the general election in November. If two or fewer candidates timely submit sufficient filings for a given office before the primary election, the office of the Clerk (hereafter, the "Clerk") will simply certify those individuals as candidates for the general election ballot, and neither their names nor the office they seek will appear on the primary election ballot. Pitkin County does not enact a county-level primary if there are no races with three or more candidates for any one race.

The HRC effectively mandates an "open primary" system for the election of Pitkin County officers since voters need not be affiliated to receive a primary election ballot with Pitkin County officer races. The rest of Colorado has effectively moved toward a "partially open primary" system due to the passage of Proposition 108 in 2016. Due to Pitkin County's Home Rule Charter, however, there remain some important distinctions. To understand this difference, first consider the manner in which primary

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> A political party's designation of a candidate simply means that all legal requirements have been satisfied for the party's name to be printed next to the candidate's name on the ballot. Political parties *designate* candidates for a primary election. The primary election itself is the process by which major (and occasionally minor) political parties *nominate* candidates to appear on a general election ballot. The party *designee* who wins the party's primary election becomes its *nominee* for the succeeding general election.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Use of the term "undesignated candidate" rather than "unaffiliated candidate" is intentional and denotes an important distinction between candidates for county office in Pitkin County from their counterparts elsewhere in Colorado. Under state law, voters' party affiliation (as reflected in the voter registration records) generally "follows them onto the ballot" if they become candidates for partisan elective office. For Pitkin County candidates, the HRC severs this complete identity between a person's party affiliation as a voter and his or her party designation as a candidate. Candidates for Pitkin County elective office are "undesignated" because they do not seek or obtain the designation of a political party; whether their voter registration records reflect a political party affiliation is an entirely separate matter. Undesignated candidates do not have any reference to a political party printed on the ballot.

elections are conducted elsewhere in Colorado. In other counties, a separate primary election ballot is prepared for voters affiliated with the major (and sometimes minor) political parties. Each party's ballot lists only that party's designees for all federal, state, district and county offices. The order in which the candidates for a given office appear on the ballot is established by lot. The party designee receiving the highest number of votes for each office on the primary election ballot becomes the party's nominee. He or she advances to the general election in November to face off against both unaffiliated candidates and the nominees of the other political parties.

Since the passage of Proposition 108, all unaffiliated voters in Colorado have had the opportunity to participate in the primary election. They remain unaffiliated and do not need to declare a "party preference" to receive every major party's primary ballot, which includes the non-partisan county race(s) on the ballot(s). The unaffiliated ballot packet explicitly instructs that the unaffiliated voter must choose only one ballot to vote and cast. Minor party voters receive a primary ballot that includes only the non-partisan county race(s) on the ballot, should there be a county-level primary. If a minor party should have a primary, then the non-partisan county race(s) would be included in that minor party primary ballot.

Pitkin County follows the same template for its primary elections with respect to offices above the county level, because state law rather than the HRC determines eligibility to vote for candidates for these offices. However, the HRC compels a different protocol for the portion of the primary election ballot devoted to races for Pitkin County offices as described above, should there be a county-level primary. This is because the HRC permits <u>all</u> county voters to vote for <u>any</u> candidate for county office, regardless of the voter's party affiliation or the candidate's party designation. Accordingly, Pitkin County preserves the non-partisan nature of the election of county offices, and participates in a primary election only when it contains a county race(s), when there are more than two candidates for county office.

### III. CANDIDATE FILING REQUIREMENTS

#### A. Introduction

Pitkin County candidates are required to file documents of two general types, "ballot access" and "campaign finance" filings. Because of its Home Rule Charter, the ballot access and campaign finance rules and filings for Pitkin County candidates are different from those that apply to candidates in other Colorado counties.

- <u>Ballot access filings</u> perfect an individual's right to appear as a candidate on an election ballot
  and, if applicable, as the designee of a political party, subject only to challenges authorized by
  state law.
- <u>Campaign finance filings</u> include those by which a candidate initially organizes a committee to support his or her candidacy, and periodic reports disclosing his or her candidate committee's contributions and expenditures.

### **B. Ballot Access Filings**

#### 1. Introduction

All candidates for Pitkin County office must file candidate acceptances and nomination petitions signed by a minimum number of electors who are registered to vote in Pitkin County. The HRC permits but does not require candidates for county office to obtain the designation of a political party.

However, if a candidate desires political party designation, he or she must obtain it in accordance with state law and the rules of the party in question.

State law divides political parties into two camps (*major* and *minor* political parties<sup>3</sup>), and provides two alternative methods for a candidate to obtain the designation of either type of party (designation by assembly and by petition). As a practical matter, however, Pitkin County candidates can obtain party designation only from either of the two *major political parties.*<sup>4</sup> Therefore, Pitkin County candidates can opt to run as undesignated candidates, as major party designees by assembly, or as major party designees by petition.<sup>5</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> A "major political party" is one whose candidate for governor in the most recent gubernatorial election received at least ten percent of the total votes cast for that office. C.R.S. § 1-1-104(22). A "minor political party" is any political party other than a "major political party." C.R.S. § 1-1-104(23). In 2018, Colorado has two major political parties (Democratic and Republican) and five minor political parties (American Constitution, Approval Voting, Green, Libertarian, and Unity).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> Designation *by assembly* of the Republican and Democratic Parties are the only available party designation options, because candidates cannot receive designation *by assembly* from the four minor parties because they will not convene county assemblies in Pitkin County.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Candidates cannot obtain designation *by petition* from *minor* political parties in Pitkin County because there are not enough registered voters affiliated with any of the minor parties in Pitkin County to satisfy the signature requirements for this manner of designation under state law. Specifically, state law requires candidates for county office who desire minor political party designation by petition to obtain signatures of registered voters affiliated with the party in question equal to a) 750, or b) 2% of total votes cast for each office at the last general election, whichever is less. None of the minor political parties have a sufficient number of affiliated voters in Pitkin County to satisfy the petition signature requirements of state law.

#### 2. Ballot Access Filings - Undesignated Candidates

Affiliated and unaffiliated electors alike may seek county elective office without first obtaining the designation of a political party. The ballot access filing requirements for undesignated candidates in Pitkin County are:

- <u>Pitkin County Candidate Affidavit [FORM 1]</u>, by which the candidate certifies that he or she has
  reviewed and is familiar with the HRC's campaign finance rules and applicable provisions of state
  campaign finance law;
- <u>Candidate Acceptance [FORM 2]</u>: Candidate files Pitkin County Home Rule Candidate Acceptance of Designation or Nomination at time nomination petition [FORM 3.25] is filed, and not later than April 8, 2024. (No later than 5 days before the deadline established by the state statute for the Secretary of State to transmit to the County Clerk the certificate in writing of the ballot order and content for the primary election.)
- Petition [FORM 3.25]: Candidate or petition circulator files Pitkin County Home Rule Nomination Petition, signed by at least 100 eligible electors of Pitkin County, not earlier than April 5, 2024 and not later than April 22, 2024. (No earlier than twenty (20) days nor later than five (5) days before the deadline established by state statute for the Secretary of State to transmit to the County Clerk the certificate the ballot order and content for the primary election.) Petition packets, provided by the Pitkin County Election Department, will be available for all candidates on March 27, 2024.
  - All petition sections must be submitted at the same time in order to review and determine sufficiency.
  - It is encouraged that petition sections are submitted in a timely manner. In the event the petition review is not found sufficient, it will be necessary to circulate entirely new petition packets and file them before April 22, 2024.
- <u>Petition Circulation List [FORM 3.50]</u>: Petition circulation list must be filed with the County Clerk and Recorder when the signed petitions are filed. (C.R.S. § 1-4-905(5))

#### 3. Ballot Access Filings - Major Party Designation by Assembly

#### a) Eligibility

A candidate who desires to obtain the designation of a political party designation must first be eligible to receive it. A "default" provision of state law requires prospective candidates to have been affiliated with the party in question by at least the first business day in January preceding the primary election (January 2<sup>nd</sup>), but only to the extent the rules of the party do not provide otherwise.<sup>6</sup> This default rule of state law does not always apply, because the internal rules of both the Democratic Party and the Republican Party may set forth other affiliation deadlines:

- <u>Democratic Party</u>: Refer to the Colorado Democratic Party Plan of Organization and Rules or contact the Pitkin County Democratic Party Chair, Betty Wallach, through email at <u>pitkincountydemocrats@outlook.com</u> or by phone 917-202-0763.
- <u>Republican Party</u>: Refer to the ByLaws of the Colorado Republican State Central Committee or contact the Pitkin County Republican Party Chair, Jon Kelly, through email at <u>jonkelly99@gmail.com</u>.

#### b) Procedure

To be named as a candidate for designation by assembly, a person must provide notice no later than 30 days before the assembly, unless otherwise provided by party rules. (C.R.S. § 1-4-601(1.5)

To obtain major political party designation by assembly, an eligible candidate must receive the votes of at least thirty percent of the accredited delegates to the county assembly of the party in question. Delegates to the county assemblies are elected at the parties' precinct caucuses. The presiding officer or secretary of the county assembly is required to file a Certificate of Designation with the Clerk not later than four days after the county assembly adjourns. (The Certificate of Designation is the assembly's presiding officer's verification to the Clerk that the candidates listed received the number of votes required by state law.) In addition, all candidates named in the Certificate of Designation must file with the Clerk a Pitkin County Home Rule Acceptance of Designation or Nomination within the same four-day period.

These ballot access filing requirements for Pitkin County candidates seeking major party designation by assembly can be summarized as follows:

- <u>Pitkin County Candidate Affidavit [FORM 1]</u>, by which the candidate certifies that he or she has
  reviewed and is familiar with the HRC's campaign finance rules and applicable provisions of state
  campaign finance law;
- <u>Candidate Acceptance [FORM 2]</u>: Candidate files Pitkin County Home Rule Candidate Acceptance of Designation or Nomination within 4 days of adjournment of county assembly.
- Petition [FORM 3.25]: Candidate or petition circulator files Pitkin County Home Rule Nomination Petition signed by at least 100 eligible electors of Pitkin County, not earlier than April 5, 2024 and not later than April 22, 2024; this petition will include the candidate's party designation on it. (No earlier than twenty (20) days nor later than five (5) days before the deadline established by state statute for the Secretary of State to transmit to the county Clerk the certificate of the ballot order and content for the primary election.) Petitions packets, provided by the Pitkin County Elections Department, will be available for all candidates on March 27, 2024.
  - All petition sections must be submitted at the same time in order to review and determine sufficiency.

- It is encouraged that petition sections are submitted in a timely manner. In the event the petition review is not found sufficient, it will be necessary to circulate entirely new petition packets and file them before April 22, 2024.
- <u>Petition Circulation List [FORM 3.50]</u>: Petition circulation list must be filed with the County Clerk and Recorder when the signed petitions are filed. (C.R.S. § 1-4-905(5))
- <u>Certificate of Designation by Assembly [FORM 5]</u>: Secretary of party's county assembly files
   Certificate of Designation by Assembly verifying that candidate received the votes of at least 30% of the accredited delegates to the county assembly; must be filed within 4 days of adjournment of county assembly.

#### 4. Ballot Access Filings - Major Party Designation by Petition

#### a) Eligibility

As with the eligibility requirements for candidates who wish to obtain political party designation by assembly, a candidate who desires to obtain the designation of a political party designation must first be eligible to receive it. In addition to meeting the eligibility requirements set forth for each office, the following also apply for candidates interested in obtaining political party designation by petition:

- Candidates who attempted and failed to receive at least 10% of the votes for the nomination at
  the party's county assembly are completely precluded from obtaining political party
  designation by petition, C.R.S. § 1-4-801(4). Candidates who did not attempt to receive
  designation at assembly may attempt to receive designation by petition.
- A candidate seeking designation by petition must have been affiliated with the political party as shown in the statewide voter registration system, no later than the first business day of the January immediately preceding the election, C.R.S. § 1-4-801(3).

#### b) Procedure

Designation by petition is the second mechanism under state law for a candidate to obtain a major political party's designation on the primary election ballot. The petition requirements of this procedure under state law are significantly more onerous than the HRC's petition requirements:

• For candidates seeking political party designation by petition, the candidate petition must be signed by the lesser of 1,000 eligible or properly affiliated voters, or by signers equal in number to 10% of the votes cast at the contested or uncontested primary election for the political party's candidate for which the petition is being circulated; or, if there was no primary, at the last preceding general election for which there was a candidate for the office in question. Since none of the county offices up for election in 2024 appeared on the 2010 primary election ballot, the number of signatures for each office is calculated by reference to total votes cast in the 2020 general election, C.R.S. § 1-4-801(2)(a).

- State law sets forth that the petition shall not be circulated prior to the third Tuesday in January and must be filed no later than the third Tuesday in March, C.R.S. § 1-4-801(5). The candidate must also file the Pitkin County Home Rule Candidate Acceptance of Designation or Nomination form [FORM 2] at the time he or she files the nomination petition, C.R.S. § 1-4-906.
  - Additionally, circulators must be a resident of the state and affiliated with the political party mentioned in the petition as shown on the statewide voter registration system, C.R.S. § 1-4-905.
  - The circulator must complete a notarized affidavit prior to filing the petition for it to be reviewed for sufficiency.
- Candidates seeking major political party designation by petition must file Pitkin County
   Nomination Petition for Candidates Seeking Major Political Party Designation by Petition [FORM 4], because state law imposes the following restrictions on petition signers:
  - Must be registered to vote in Pitkin County and affiliated with the political party for at least 22 days before the date they sign the petition, C.R.S. § 1-2-219;
  - o Cannot sign any other petition for any other candidate for the same office.

Upon filing of Pitkin County Nomination Petition for Candidates Seeking Major Political Party Designation by Petition [FORM 4], the County Clerk and Recorder or their designee will review all petition information and verify the information against the statewide voter registration system, C.R.S. § 1-4-908(1). After review, the Clerk will notify the candidate of the number of valid signatures and whether the petition is sufficient or insufficient.

Finally, because the above petition process addresses the desire to obtain partisan political party designation, and because the Home Rule Charter sets forth different petition requirements and timelines than those set forth in state law, the candidate must additionally comply with the HRC requirements. Therefore, if a candidate's petitions are sufficient to obtain political party designation, the candidate must also circulate a petition [FORM 3.25] and obtain 100 signatures of eligible electors of Pitkin County who may or may not be affiliated with the political party and may or may not have signed the petition of another candidate for the same office. The candidate must submit the petition no sooner than 20 days before and no later than 5 days before the ballot certification date. Additionally, candidates whose petitions were not sufficient to obtain political party designation by petition may still access the ballot as an undesignated candidate.

These ballot access filing requirements for Pitkin County candidates seeking major party designation by petition can be summarized as follows:

- <u>Pitkin County Candidate Affidavit [FORM 1]</u>, by which the candidate certifies that he or she has reviewed and is familiar with the HRC's campaign finance rules and applicable provisions of state campaign finance law;
- <u>Candidate Acceptance [FORM 2]</u>: Candidate files Pitkin County Home Rule Candidate Acceptance of Designation or Nomination at time nomination petition is filed [FORM 3], and not later than April 22, 2024.
- Petitioning for a Major Party designation requires two petition processes:
  - <u>Pitkin County Home Rule Nomination Petition for Candidates Seeking Major Party Designation by Petition [FORM 4]</u>: Candidate or petition circulator files Pitkin County Home Rule Nomination Petition signed by at least the minimum number of eligible electors of Pitkin County affiliated with the specified political party as set forth for each office, between January 18 & March 15, 2024.
  - Petition [FORM 3.25]: Candidate or petition circulator files Pitkin County Home Rule Nomination Petition signed by at least 100 eligible electors of Pitkin County, not earlier than April 5, 2024 and not later than April 22, 2024. This petition will include the candidate's party designation on it if obtained, or no political party information if his/her party designation petition was deemed insufficient and the candidate still desires to run as an undesignated candidate. (No earlier than twenty (20) days nor later than five (5) days before the deadline established by state statute for the Secretary of State to transmit to the County Clerk the certificate of the ballot order and content for the primary election.) Pitkin County Election Petition packets, will be available for all candidates on March 27, 2024.
    - All petition sections must be submitted at the same time in order to review and determine sufficiency.
    - It is encouraged that petition sections are submitted in a timely manner. In the event the petition review is not found sufficient, it will be necessary to circulate entirely new petition packets and file them before April 22, 2024.
- <u>Petition Circulation List [FORM 3.50]</u>: Petition circulation list must be filed with the County Clerk and Recorder when the signed petition is filed. (C.R.S. § 1-4-905(5))

### C. Campaign Finance Filings

#### 1. Introduction

Pitkin County is the only county in Colorado that has adopted its own campaign finance regulations, which are set forth at HRC § 6.6 and Title 4 of the Pitkin County Code. The HRC incorporates or relies on the substantive concepts and procedures of state campaign finance law. The principal sources include article XXVIII of the Colorado Constitution, the Fair Campaign Practices Act, C.R.S. §§ 1-

45-101 et seq. ("FCPA"), and the Campaign & Political Finance Rules issued by the Secretary of State ("CPF Rules"). In other respects, however, the HRC effectively preempts state campaign finance law.

Campaign finance filings are of two general types, consisting of organizational filings and periodic disclosure reports. <u>Unlike candidates in other counties</u>, <u>Pitkin County candidates must file all</u> forms and disclosures with the Clerk and Recorder's office, rather than the Secretary of State.

#### 2. Candidate Organizational Filings

For those seeking county office, the obligation to comply with Pitkin County's campaign finance rules is triggered when they become a "candidate." The HRC defines a candidate as a person who "publicly announces his/her intention to seek election to any elective County office, has filed with the County Clerk his/her nominating petition for such office, or has been chosen to fill a vacancy." The term "candidate" includes that person's "candidate committee," i.e., the political committee established by the candidate to accept contributions and make expenditures in support of his or her candidacy.<sup>7</sup>

Before publicly announcing an intention to seek office, prospective candidates should file the following organizational documents:

- <u>Pitkin County Candidate Affidavit [FORM 1]</u>, by which the candidate certifies that he or she has
  reviewed and is familiar with the HRC's campaign finance rules and applicable provisions of state
  campaign finance law;
- <u>Pitkin County New Committee Registration Form [FORM 6]</u>, which establishes a candidate committee to accept contributions and make expenditures. Candidates who will accept contributions in furtherance of their candidacy <u>must</u> form a candidate committee by filing the New Committee Registration Form <u>before</u> accepting any contributions;
- <u>Pitkin County Designation of Affiliated Political Committees [FORM 7]</u>, in which the candidate identifies all political committees, if any, known to be making expenditures in support of his or her candidacy.

#### 3. Candidate Periodic Filings

Candidate committees are required to periodically disclose their financial activity by filing Pitkin County Reports of Contributions and Expenditures [FORM 11] with the Clerk. Candidates who do not accept contributions but make expenditures from their own money are required to file the same forms, itemizing expenditures of \$20 or more.

Reports of Contributions and Expenditures can be filed in person in paper format during regular business hours of the Clerk's office (8:30 am – 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday, except for legal and county holidays). The reports also can be filed electronically, by fax (970-445-3007), or by email (elections@pitkincounty.com). In order to facilitate even-handed application of these deadlines for all filing entities, all organizational and disclosure reports required by the HRC – whether filed in person or electronically – will be considered timely only if received by the Elections Department at or before the regular close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the filing deadline.

#### 5. Contribution Limits

The Home Rule Charter prohibits any person from making "a contribution in an amount which exceeds five hundred (\$500) dollars to any candidate, or to any political committee making coordinated expenditures for the purpose of supporting or opposing the nomination, retention, election or defeat of any candidate (the \$500 limit pertains to the tenure as a candidate or an election year)." Several important points should be noted about this HRC provision:

- Unlike state law, the HRC does not prohibit contributions to candidates by non-natural "persons," or
  entities such as corporations, limited liability companies, and limited partnerships. Although county
  candidate committees can accept contributions from these entities, caution is urged with respect to
  the following two types of business organizations:
  - Under Colorado's law of business organizations, general partnerships are sometimes not considered to be legally distinct "persons" from their partners. A candidate who accepts the maximum contribution from a partnership and its partners may be determined to have violated

- the HRC's contribution limits, because a general partnership's status as a legal entity distinct from its owners for purposes of campaign finance law is unclear;
- Contributions from sole proprietorships operating under a trade name should be attributed to and reported under the name of the proprietor, not the trade name. Under Colorado law, sole proprietorships are not legally distinct persons from their owners.

#### 6. Coordinated and Independent Expenditures

The HRC requires both the candidate and the third person to disclose <u>all</u> coordinated expenditures, regardless of amount. The candidate or candidate committee makes this disclosure in particular portions of the Pitkin County Report of Contributions and Expenditures [FORM 11], discussed above. The third person who actually incurred the coordinated expense or made the expenditure on the candidate's behalf is required to disclose all coordinated expenditures, and all independent expenditures in excess of \$250, by filing with the Clerk, a Report of Coordinated/Independent Expenditures [FORM 9]. (An "independent expenditure" is defined by the HRC as any expenditure other than a coordinated expenditure.) This report must be filed not more than one week after the funds representing the expenditure are delivered, committed or obligated; provided that, if the coordinated or independent expenditure is made in the eight days preceding an election, the report must be filed within twenty-four hours after the funds representing the expenditure are delivered, committed or obligated.

#### 7. Penalties

The HRC contains penalties for violation of its campaign finance rules. Any person who violates a provision of HRC § 6.6 is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment in the Pitkin County jail for not more than 10 days, or both. In addition, candidates who knowingly violate a provision of HRC § 6.6 or conspire with another to do so are denied the right to take the oath of office for which they were elected, or the office is deemed vacated if they have already taken the oath. Any person who believes a violation of HRC § 6.6 can file a complaint with the County Clerk & Recorder.

#### REPORT OF COORDINATED AND/OR INDEPENDENT EXPENDITURE(S)

Pitkin County's Home Rule Charter ("HRC") requires persons making "coordinated expenditures" in any amount and "independent expenditures" in excess of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) to report such expenditures to the Pitkin County Clerk & Recorder. (HRC § 6.6.2). The report filing required by the HRC is in addition to and not in lieu of any other reports for the same or similar expenditures that must be filed with the Colorado Secretary of State pursuant to Colo. Const. Art. XXVIII and/or the Fair Campaign Practices Act, Colo. Rev. Stat. ("CRS") § 1-45-101 et seq.

The report must be filed no later than one (1) week after the funds are delivered, committed, or obligated. However, if the expenditure is made in the eight (8) days preceding an election, this report must be filed no later than twenty-four (24) hours after the funds are delivered, committed or obligated. (HRC § 6.6.4)

The following definitions apply for purposes of this report (underscored words within a definition refer to other defined terms):

<u>"Candidate"</u> means a <u>person</u> who publicly announces his/her intention to seek election to any elective County office, has filed with the County Clerk & Recorder his/her nominating petition for such office, or has been chosen to fill a vacancy on the Board of County Commissioners. <u>"Candidate"</u> includes any candidate committee, as that term is defined by the Colorado Fair Campaign Practices Act, C.R.S. § 1-45-103, associated with a candidate. (HRC § 6.6.1(a))

"<u>Election</u>" means any general, primary, or special election held within Pitkin County at which any person or persons are certified to appear on the ballot at the general election for, or are elected to, the office of County Commissioner, Sheriff, County Clerk and Recorder, or County Assessor. (HRC § 6.6.1(d))

<u>"Expenditure"</u> means the payment, pledge, promise of payment of money or anything of value, or other obligation, loan, or advance of money, whether or not legally enforceable, or goods, materials, services or facilities, by any person, political committee, or agent of any of them, for the purpose of influencing the nomination, retention, election, or defeat of any <u>candidate</u>. (HRC § 6.6.1(e))

- <u>"Coordinated expenditure"</u> means an <u>expenditure</u> made by any <u>person</u> in coordination, cooperation, consultation, or concert with or at the request or suggestion of a <u>candidate</u> or agent of a <u>candidate</u>. <u>Coordinated expenditures</u> are treated as <u>contributions</u>, and count against the contribution limitations set forth in HRC § 6.6.2. (HRC § 6.6.1(c))
- <u>"Independent expenditure"</u> means an <u>expenditure</u> that is not a <u>coordinated expenditure</u>. (HRC § 6.6.1(f))

<u>"Person"</u> means any individual, partnership, corporation, association, firm, committee, governmental entity, or other organization or group of persons, however organized. (HRC § 6.6.1(g))

The Report of Contributions and Expenditures is a financial report required for all Pitkin County candidate committees, political committees and issue committees that accept contributions or make expenditures to support or oppose the election of a candidate for Pitkin County elective office, or the passage or defeat of a ballot issue or referred or initiated ballot question to be voted on by Pitkin County electors.

The report is comprised of seven basic data entry pages along with several informational and instructional pages. The data entry forms consist of the Report of Contributions and Expenditures with the Detailed Summary, Schedules A, B, C, D, and the Statement of Non-Monetary Contributions. Completion of Schedules A, B, C, D and the Statement of Non-Monetary Contribution forms should be done prior to completion of the Report of Contributions and Expenditures and Detailed Summary pages. Listed below are brief descriptions of what each data entry page accomplishes to help you complete and finalize this report.

#### **Report of Contributions and Expenditures** (page 1)

A summary page of the committee or party name, address, financial institution, registered agent and the contribution/expenditure totals for a specific reporting period.

#### **Detailed Summary page (page 2)**

Summarizes totals for all other data entry forms. Complete page 1 and 2 forms last.

#### Schedule A

This form is used to itemize and disclose monetary contributions received by the candidate or committee of \$20 or more.

#### Schedule B

This form is used to itemize and disclose expenditures of \$20 or more paid out or incurred by the candidate or committee.

#### Schedule C

This form details loans received and repaid by the candidate or committee.

#### Schedule D

This form is used to itemize and disclose a contribution that has been received by the candidate or committee and is being returned to the donor.

#### **Statement of Non-Monetary Contributions**

This form details contributions received by a candidate or candidate committee that are tangible and can be assessed a fair market value. In addition, "coordinated expenditures" should be reported on this form, whether tangible or monetary in character. Generally speaking, "coordinated expenditures" are expenditures made by any person in coordination, cooperation, consultation or concert with – or at the request or suggestion of – a candidate or agent of a candidate. Coordinated expenditures are treated as direct contributions to the candidate with whom they are coordinated, and count against the contribution limits set forth in § 6.6.2 of the Pitkin County Home Rule Charter.

The Report must be received by the Pitkin County Clerk and Recorder's office at 530 E. Main St., Suite 104, Aspen, CO 81611, during regular business hours (8:30 am – 4:30 pm, Monday-Friday except legal holidays), on or before the due date. Postmark dates are not recognized.

The reports also can be filed electronically, by fax (970-445-3007), or by email (elections@pitkincounty.com) and must be followed up with the original document within seven calendar days. In order to facilitate even-handed application of these deadlines for all filing entities, all organizational and disclosure reports required by the HRC — whether filed in person or electronically — will be considered timely only if received by the Elections Department at or before the regular close of business (4:30 p.m.) on the filing deadline. The candidate or registered agent who signs this report is responsible for the content and accuracy of the report.
